ISRM JOURNAL

The ISRM Journal was an initiative started in 2021 by Dr Gavriel Schneider, ANZ Chapter Chair, and Ron Amran, at the time Perth Chapter Chair. Having released the first issue in April 2022, it was decided that there was the scope to turn that into an international journal.

Dr Paul Johnston, who took on the role of Journal Editor from Ron, together with his team, produced the first International Issue in October 2022: 'Security: Past, Present and Future'.

ISRM UoG UNIVERSITY CHAPTER

The ISRM has had a close relationship with the University of Gloucestershire for the last two years, collaborating on offering modules on strategic risk and crisis management as part of their academic framework, but also working together on international development programmes.

This relationship was formally endorsed when the UoG established the first ever dedicated ISRM University Chapter. This has been designed to give students on a wide variety of security, risk, business and management programmes access to the ISRM resources, as well as providing them with a platform to establish their own programmes and develop their own networks.

With 250 MBA students already signed up as ISRM Student Members, we are looking forward to seeing how the UoG Chapter can establish its own identity, and then help set a template that can be utilised by other universities across the ISRM global academic network.

ISRM Partner Organisation of the Year Award

ERASMUS PLUS BUILD PROGRAMME (BUILDING UNIVERSITIES FOR LEADING IN DISASTER RESILIENCE)

The Erasmus Plus programme, headed by the University of Gloucestershire, is a multi-national initiative looking to utilise the skills and capacities inherent in universities to create centres of excellence that can support the widest range of risk reduction, disaster response and societal resilience development programmes.

The BUiLD initiative is already highly active in Indonesia, with eight universities as part of the national network. Each university has ownership of a different aspect of risk reduction and disaster response, but parallel to that has three separate areas of influence: upwards, in supporting the development of appropriate government policies and frameworks; downwards, in ensuring that local communities are empowered to take ownership of their own disaster reduction programmes, and outwards, in developing multi-member networks of supporting stakeholders and partner organisations.

The ISRM is a full Partner Organisation in BUiLD, and we have seen how the template developed in Indonesia has real value across a range of contexts and risk environments.

In a world where risk reduction and disaster management is becoming increasingly urgent, the BUiLD program offers an immediate framework that makes a real difference to the world we live in.

ISRM Training Programme of the Year Award

LEVEL 5 AWARD IN PRESILIENCE, LEADERSHIP AND HIGH PERFORMANCE

It is widely recognised that resilience can no longer be seen merely as a post-event response that tries to re-establish order and recovery, but must be seen from a holistic perspective as an all-of-society or whole-enterprise approach.

The Level 5 Award in Presilience, Leadership and High Performance, developed by Risk2Solutions (Australia) is the first programme to capture all of these issues in a single, highly accessible format that allows any organisation, whatever its size or sector, to become aware of the issues around Presilience. It offers a range of processes and templates that would allow organisations to develop and embed Presilience management frameworks that are most appropriate to their own needs.

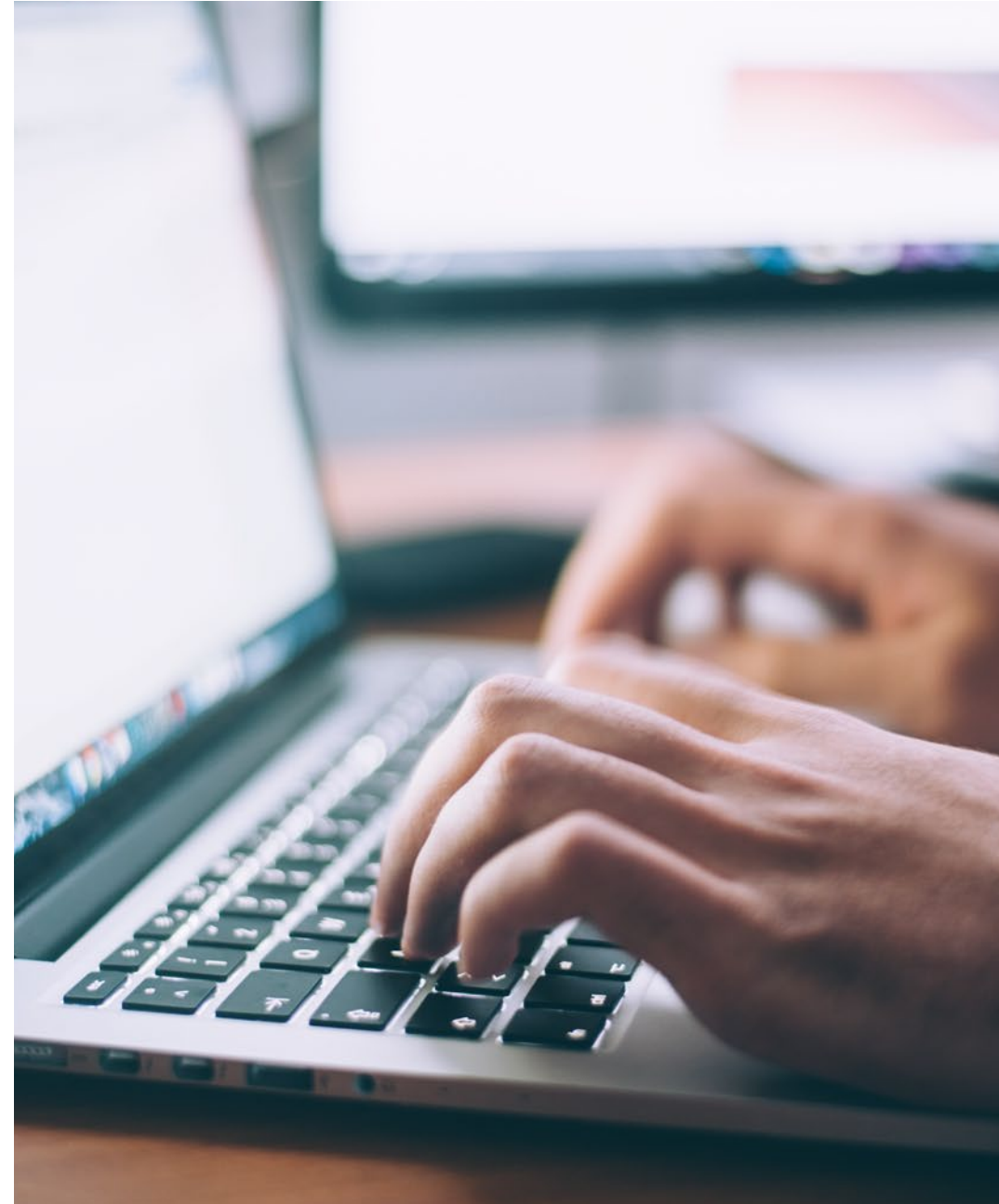

ISRM Fellow of the Year Award

FIGEN MURRAY OBE

On 22nd May 2017, a suicide bomber at the Ariadne Grande concert at Manchester arena killed 22 innocent people.

One of them was Martyn Flett. When Martyn's mother attended a concert sometime later, she was appalled to see that little if anything had been done to improve the security management systems that were in place to prevent such another attack happening. Since that day, Figen Murray, Martyn's mother, has not only worked tirelessly to raise awareness of the issues around public space security, but has created a movement that has pressured the UK government into introducing legislation specifically designed to ensure that the security management processes in public spaces are appropriate to the threat levels and potential damage that they create.

Figen Murray has been recognised for her work by the British government with the award of an OBE (Order of the British Empire), but more significantly, the Protect Duty legislation introduced as a direct result of her campaigning has been named Martyn's Law, in memory of Martyn Flett and the other 21 people who died with him, and the countless others who were directly or indirectly impacted by that event. This ISRM Fellow of the Year Award is just a small token of the appreciation that the entire security and risk management community feel for Figen, and the debt that that the entire country owes her.



ISRM Young Professional of the Year Award

Satia is an outstanding example of how one person can make their voice a significant tool in the fight to do what is right. As well as being a dedicated security professional, she was an outstanding spokesperson for equality, diversity and inclusivity in all of its forms. Her ability to develop coalitions of organisations and supporters has been a significant part of the increased recognition and acceptance of the fact that we need to have a full and open discussion about all aspects of diversity and inclusion, both in the workplace and on a wider societal scale. Her presence and influence has been recently recognised by the appointment as the full-time CEO of International Professional Security Association (IPSA).

Garry Bergin, Chair of the ISRM Ireland Chapter, has not only established the ISRM as a major presence in the Irish security and risk management arena, but has worked tirelessly with multiple other organisations to ensure that the sector as a whole maintains its focus on increased professionalisation at every level of operations. He is a Chartered Security Professional (CSyP); Director, Board Member and Lecturer with the Security Institute of Ireland; ranked #11 globally in 2021 by IFSEC in the Commercial Security (Thought Leadership/ Academic/ Association Figures) category; winner of the 'Bill Zalud Memorial Award' in 2022 for professional excellence and outstanding service in the security industry internationally, awarded by the International Foundation for Protection Officers (IFPO), and 2022 Irish OSPA Winner (Outstanding Security Consultant) category.
